## Autumn Series March to May 2026 – Renewal

Our journey through life requires attention to changes and circumstances as they arise – this involves frequent renewal. Each circumstance comes with its own challenges - but we can approach it with a heart ready to receive God’s love and grace. Finding even small moments of renewal can change our perspective completely. Through prayer, reading Scripture, meditating, or even just enjoying nature, we can renew our relationship with God. Renewals can have to do with responding to failure, doing things differently or in developing inward and personal growth. This Series brings examples of each of these types of renewal in examples from the Bible, and shows how we can use these to strengthen our personal relationship with God, and come to better understand His Plan.

### Part 1: Renewal: Responding to Failure –

Isaiah 43:19: *Behold, I will do a new thing; now it shall spring forth; shall ye not know it? I will even make a way in the wilderness, and rivers in the desert.*

Ephesians 4:22-24: *That ye put off concerning the former conversation the old man, which is corrupt according to the deceitful lusts; **And be renewed** in the spirit of your mind; **And that ye put on the new man**, which after God is created in righteousness and true holiness.*

### Part 3: Renewal: Inward and Personal Growth-

Romans 12:2: *And be not conformed to this world: but **be ye transformed by the renewing of your mind**, that ye may prove what is that good, and acceptable, and perfect, will of God.*

- Example of David – restoration after transgression
- Personal Renewal – overcoming the evil
- From Saul to Paul – losing your life to find it
- Whitsuntide – a Taste of Renewal
- The New Covenant with Israel – New Heaven and New Earth

Presenters and Preachers will have opportunities through these topics to explain different aspects of our Church teachings including the Promises to Israel, the regathering of the 144,000, the hope of the preservation wholly of spirit and soul and body, the promised Power to overcome the evil within us, and the hope to be able to live a life of holiness to God as Jesus did.

1 <sup>st</sup> March	Singleton	Cycles of Nature – There Is a Time for Everything	Ps 107:33-38; Eccl 3:1-15; Matt 6:25-34	Life is renewed with each generation – without history there would be no present. God's Power over nature
8 <sup>th</sup> March	Windsor	Starting again - Noah and Nimrod	Gen 8:15 – 9:11; 10:6-12; Matt 24:37-39	Noah sought to God, but Nimrod sought to his own abilities. Despite the lessons that should have been learnt, mankind continued to sin.
15 <sup>th</sup> March	Terrigal	Rebuilding the Temple – Nehemiah and Ezra	Nehemiah 8; Jno 2:12-22	The first Temple was destroyed because of disobedience – the renewed Temple was launched on understanding the Laws of God
22 <sup>nd</sup> March	Online	Identifying a Need for renewal – the Process of Change	Jer 18:1-10; 1 Cor 12: Romans 9:20-24	Renewal requires change, and most people don't like change. Sometimes our circumstances dictate the need.
29 <sup>h</sup> March	Sydney	Palm Sunday – Preparing for Renewal	Hab 2:1-3; Matt 21:1-11	Palm Sunday demonstrated that the need for renewal was felt, and many recognised God's Power to make it happen.

3 <sup>rd</sup> April	Sing/Terr 9.30am	Passover - Easter Friday	Exo 12:14-36; Jno 19:17-42	Easter Friday the sacrificial Lamb was slain, overcoming Satan's power, and renewed the way we can approach God
5 <sup>h</sup> April	Singleton	Easter – A Renewed State Spiritually	Isa 60:1-5; Jno 20:1-10	Jesus' resurrection showed God's Power over physical death, and offered us the hope of immortality.
12 <sup>th</sup> April	Windsor	Re-establishing God's Instructions – Hezekiah and Josiah	2 Chron 29-31; 2 Kings 22-23; Rom 13:8-14	The Book of the Law had been lost and was found – how could it be understood? How should we keep the Laws today.
19 <sup>th</sup> April	Terrigal	Progression from Old to New Testament	Isa 59:1-8; Matt 5:13-20	Mankind's relationship with God was renewed through the New Testament, and should have been a progression in relationship with God, but it has been treated as a new rather than renewed relationship.
26 <sup>th</sup> April	Sydney	Responding to Renewal – Jonah and Elijah	Jon 1:1-3, 3:1-5, 4:1-11; 1 Kgs 18:25-46; Rom 7	Jonah preached renewal, but was not prepared for it; Elijah convinced the people of God's Power, but the change did not continue.
		<b>Renewal: Inward and Personal</b>		
3 <sup>rd</sup> May	Singleton	David – Example of restoration after transgression	2 Sam 12:7-23; Ps 51:10; 2 Chro 7:12-22	Our sins (wrong doings) separate us from God, as did David's; through repentance and forsaking sin David renewed his relationship with God.
10 <sup>th</sup> May	Windsor	Personal Renewal – overcoming the evil	Isa 1:12-20; Rom 12:1-2	Sometimes renewal requires a reset in the way we look at things, and this in turn will change the things we want to do.
17 <sup>th</sup> May	Terrigal	From "Saul to Paul" – losing your life to find it	Exo 3:12; Acts 9:1-18; Matt 16:15-28	Saul thought he had "everything going" for him, but abruptly realised he did not. He had to lose his desire for what he thought was right to learn God's Truth. How can we know what is God's Truth for us today.
24 <sup>th</sup> May	Whitsunday	Whitsuntide – a Promise of Renewal	Deut 16:9-12; Acts 2:1-13	A renewal of God's relationship with mankind came with the outpouring of the Holy Ghost at Pentecost
31 <sup>st</sup> May	Sydney	The New Covenant with Israel – New Heaven and New Earth	Jer 31:31-4; Heb 8:7-13; Rev 21:1-5;	The old covenant is renewed, but without the old the new could not have come into place.
